Each year the Polish Heritage Festival committee challenges itself to come up with fresh ideas, events and individuals to showcase the best of who we are. This, I believe, is our greatest strength. This year was no different with the theme "The Best of Buffalo Polonia!"

For your listening and dancing pleasure this year's festival featured the music of: The Knewz, The Buffalo Touch, New Direction, The Concertina AllStars, Scrubby with Phocus Polkas, and Stephanie Pietrzak & the Honky Tonk Band! Plus, the Harmony Polish Folk Ensemble also performed! There were contests, a pageant, Polish/ American food, and a huge

theme basket auction!

This year the festival's featured attraction was the Batalion Burza! This was their first performance in New York State! The Batalion Burza is a dynamic group of historians who've been inspired by the story of the proud and tragic Warsaw Uprising of 1944. They're driven to deliver the story of Polish people during the Second World War to the audiences across the USA through serious and dynamic living history interpretation, and by supporting like-minded organizations and projects. Their mission is to inspire people with that Polish story so they'll explore history for themselves, long after their work is done.

They believe that educating the public through the use of a variety of meaningful artifacts, engaging storyboards, and energetic personal interpretation in authentic period clothing. They realize their mission by creating a fun, educational, and exciting atmosphere where all who visit can leave with good memories, valuable knowledge, and a renewed respect for the story of the Poles from the 1940s. They also offer consultation and professional services for films and other artistic endeavors that promote Polish history.

We also received very good coverage from the Buffalo News which ran color photos of festival events on its picture page in its Saturday and Sunday editions. The AM-POL Eagle also printed great photos and an awesome article from which you can read inside on the centerspread of this issue. Best Anise Pierniki

from the 2011 Polish Heritage Festival

Mix together until well blended:

1 cup lard (do not substitute)

1 1/2 cups sugar

3 large eggs Add:

Dissolve together in a small cup:

3 Tablespoons hot water 1/2 teaspoon Hartshorn (baking ammonia

which can only be purchased in pharmacies)

After dissolved and water has cooled, add:

1/4 teaspoon anise oil

Combine: 4 cups flour

2 teaspoons baking powder

Clip & Save

Add flour mixture and water/anise oil mixture alternately with lard/sugar blend. Beat together until well mixed.

Chill dough overnight.

Bake at 325° for 12-15 minutes or until lightly browned.

Once cookies have cooled, frost with glaze and decorate with colored sugar crystals.

1 cup confectioner sugar

3 tablespoons cold water

(you may need to add more if too thick)
